CHAPLAIN'S CORNER*Dr. Bruce Street*

I was fascinated with the story of Felix Baumgartner.

Skydiver Felix Baumgartner earned his place in the history books on Sunday after overcoming concerns with the power for his visor heater that impaired his vision and nearly jeopardized the mission. Felix reached an estimated speed of 833.9 mph (1,342.8 kmh) or Mach 1.24. This preliminary figure would make him the first man to break the speed of sound in freefall and set more records while delivering valuable data for space exploration. After reaching an altitude of 128,100 feet (39,045 meters) in a helium-filled balloon, Felix Baumgartner completed a record-breaking jump from the edge of space, exactly 65 years after Chuck Yeager first broke the sound barrier flying in an experimental rocket powered airplane.

The 43-year-old Austrian skydiving

expert also broke two other world records (highest freefall, highest manned balloon flight), leaving the longest freefall to project mentor Col. Joe Kittinger. (Quoted from Flight Journal website).

Wow! When I was in the Canadian Forces I had 171 parachute descents, but nothing at all even close to this. I believe the greatest height I ever jumped from was 1400 feet. Of course, the objective of delivering troops from the air is actually based upon the lowest altitude possible to accomplish the task. In any event, it's now great to watch others do it.

As I write this the Gospel passage for the coming Sunday is Mark 10:35-45. Here Jesus says, "but whoever wishes to become great among you must be your servant, and whoever wishes to be first among you must be slave of all." This was his response to James

and John who had just requested places of power in the coming kingdom. He is not speaking here of skydiving to earth but he is talking about going down instead of up. He is talking about service to others and that is what the Kingdom of God is all about. Abraham Lincoln is attributed with the statement, "No man stands so tall as when he stoops to help a child." Others have modified this to read, "No one stands so tall as the one who stoops to serve."

Hopefully our service to the country will continue to be expressed through service to those experiencing poverty, hunger and homelessness.

Unfortunately, these numbers are climbing. We will never descend as quickly as Felix Baumgartner but may we always be able to stoop to serve.

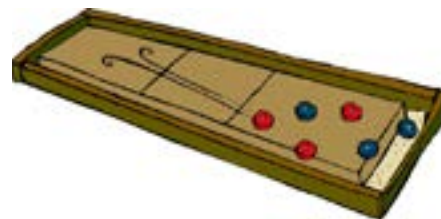

Make your way to Branch 530 Legion, take part in the Parade and then hop on a bus and visit the various Open Houses that are being held at all six K-W Veteran's clubs.

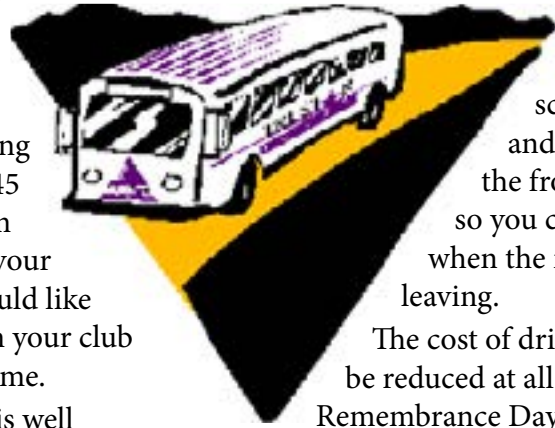
As Remembrance Day falls on a Sunday this year, we will be using 4 buses instead of two buses, the GRT City buses will be for Older Veterans and School Buses will be for the younger ones. This will make your trip a lot easier.

A School Bus will follow the City Buses for the entire day. When you have completed your socializing, arrange for a friend to pick you up or take a cab.

The Buses will be going from club to club at 45 minute intervals from noon till 5.45 pm, if your spouse or friends would like to accompany you on your club visits, they are Welcome.

Take advantage of this well organized transportation network to participate in this year's Remembrance Day activities in a safe and responsible manner. Bus passes are available at the bar
